Our vision is to provide the students in Centerville with a bright future.






The education sector continues to attract new and well-educated, highly-qualified teachers to meet the demands of the population growth of Centerville.












After the full scale development program that was instituted last year, our goal for this year will be an cooperative development program allowing teachers to provide in-service within their own schools.






We have our eyes on the future and the education sector continues to partner with the community to create a learning opportunities.

The education sector will support Option 3 as a means to meet the needs of this goal in the coming year.








Centerville's universities are growing with an increase in programs and professors and we look forward to the opportunities that these programs will provide our students in the year.

Used Funds: 32,033,925


Available Funds: -2,187,644
